The Presidents' Letter

Our January meeting was well attended with 44 members present. I gave a presentation on House Bill 29 that was introduced in January allowing the National Electrical Code to be amended, which is currently prohibited by Kentucky Statute. This bill could potentially be very damaging to our electrical industry and to the safety of Kentucky residents. At the end of the meeting, a motion passed stating that the ECHL is openly opposing House Bill 29 as introduced.

The 2023 National Electrical Code is now in effect. Please keep in mind that the 2023 NEC Sections 210.52(C), 230.67, and 314.27(C) are not mandatory until July 15, 2026. In addition, the requirement for GFCI protection for personnel for receptacles over 125-volt listed in the 2023 NEC Section 210.8(A) and the requirement for GFCI protection listed in 210.8(D) (8), (9), (10), and (11) is not mandatory until UL Standards 943 and 101 are revised.

Make sure you check with your respective electrical inspector before you do any installation covered by these sections!

After July 2024, any license renewals for contractor, master, or electrician licenses will be for two years. With this next renewal, you will pay a fee for two years. When you renew again two years later, you will be required to have 12 hours of continuing education for each license that is being renewed and will pay a fee for two years. Call the department at (502) 573-2002 with any questions.

Hook up delays

One of the problems that continually hinder our ability to connect underground services in a timely manner is obstructions preventing access to the pad mount transformer and/or splice box. The crews often arrive to discover debris such as dirt, rocks or discarded building material piled up blocking the area needed to connect the service. When you know service is about to be connected, make sure the area is clear and free of any hazards. We will not move any of the objects. Also make sure there is no silt fencing in the way as well. Our crew will not be able to return the same day to connect the service. This means a several day delay in returning.

Code Corner

Article 220

If you are doing a load calculation on a dwelling unit there are some changes and additions, you need to be aware of that are in the 2023 *NEC*. Here were several additions to the Article that will change what you have done in the past calculations.

A new subsection was added, 220.5(C) Floor Areas: the floor for each floor shall be calculated from the outside dimensions of the building, dwelling unit or other area involved. For dwelling units, the calculated floor area shall not include open porches or other areas not adaptable for future use as a habitable room or occupiable space. Areas such as garages, or unused or unfinished spaces are no longer excluded from the calculated floor area of the building, dwelling unit, or other areas. The reasoning behind this change by Code Making Panel 2, that previous language that it may be considered such areas were exempt as not adaptable for future use. These areas are often finished and used as ancillary space for habitable portions in dwellings, buildings, or other space in the square footage calculation.

A new section was added the Article 220, **220.57 Electrical Vehicle Supply Equipment** (**EVSE**) **Load.** *The EVSE load shall be calculated at either 7200 watts (volt amperes) or the nameplate rating of the equipment, whichever is larger.* Code Making Panel 2 reasoning was based on 7200va on a 30 ampere 240-volt single phase circuit. With electric vehicles becoming more prevalent that this infrastructure they felt this change was needed in the *NEC*. I personally think this is a good addition the NEC, I may not see it in my lifetime, but the internal combustion engine will no longer be produced by the auto makers and vehicles will be powered by electric or some other power source. Someday down the road a gas station will be like the pay phone, have you seen many of them lately?

Top Three Code Violations Louisville Metro Inspections FEBRUARY 2025

These violations are costing you time and money.

1. NEC Article # 200.6(B) AWG or Larger

An insulated grounded conductor 4 AWG or larger shall be identified by one of the following means:

200.6(B)(1) A continuous white outer finish 200.6(B)(2) A continuous gray outer finish

200.6(B)(3) Three continuous white or gray stripes along the conductor's entire length on

other than green

200.6(B)(4) At the time of installation, by a dis-

tinctive white or gray marking at its terminations. This marking shall encircle the conductor or insulation.

2. NEC Article # 352.46 Bushings

Where a conduit enters a box, fitting or other enclosure, a bushing or adapter shall be provided to protect the wire from abrasion unless the box, fitting, or enclosure design provides equivalent protection.

3. NEC Article # 250.64(B)(2) Exposed to Physical Damage

A 6 AWG or larger copper or aluminum grounding electrode conductor exposed to physical damage shall be protected in rigid metal conduit (RMC), intermediate metal conduit (IMC), rigid polyvinyl chloride conduit (PVC), reinforced thermosetting resin conduit type XW (RTRC-XW), electrical metallic tubing (EMT), or cable arm.

We hope this will help save you time and money on inspection fees by reviewing the articles and making sure you have not violated the code before calling for the initial inspection.
